- The word 'alphabet' comes from the first 2 letters of the Greek alphabet. They are called

α**β**

alpha and beta.

- **Aesop** was a storyteller in ancient Greece. He collected and told animal stories. Each story had a clever animal who solved a problem. The stories are now called Aesop's Fables.



- The **Arabian Nights** is supposed to be a collection of stories told by Queen Sheherazade. She was in danger of being killed by her husband, the Sultan Shahriah. So every night, she told him a story. But she would stop at the most interesting part, promising to continue the next night. The Sultan was so interested, he did not kill her the next day. And so it went on. Some of the stories Sheherazade related are — Aladdin and the Magic Lamp, Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves and The Adventures of Sindbad.
- These words have **all five vowels** — Mozambique (an African country), Sequoia (a kind of tree) and education (a noun).
- **Cough, plough, dough, rough, thought** - all these words have **ough** in them. But say them aloud and see how differently each is pronounced!
